


Quick guide for Zotero Registration and joining a group (i.e. Feldenkrais Studies)


This quick guide is only using the Zotero web interface (NOT the standalone or browser plugin versions).

1.) Zotero Registration

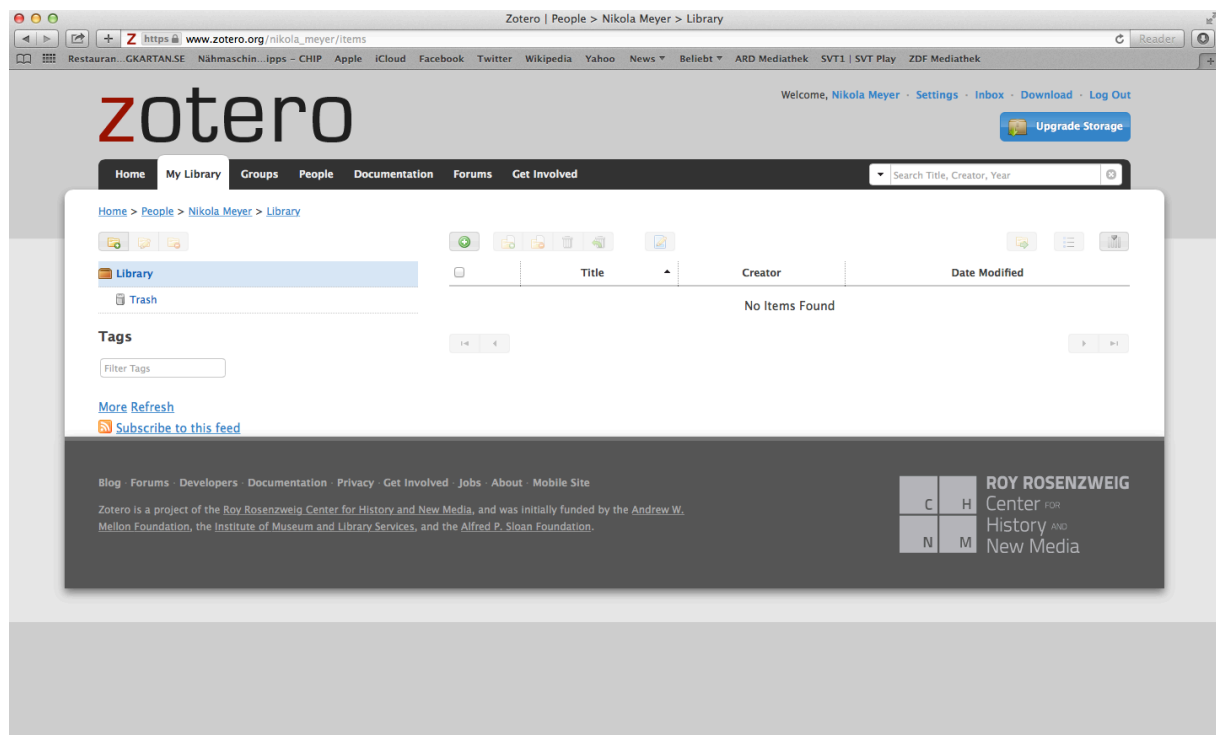


